- 1) Participation in at least four job fairs by station personnel who have substantial responsibility in the making of hiring decisions
- 2) Hosting of at least one job fair.
- 3) Co-sponsoring at least one job fair with organizations in the business and professional community whose membership includes substantial participation of women and minorities.

1.	16	CodComm Inc. provides all contest winners, and any visitors of the stations the opportunity to tour the radio stations and talk with the staff. During this time, careers in broadcasting are discussed and visitors are educated about the broadcasting industry. The tour includes information about how the broadcasting industry strives to serve its local community. Visitors are asked to give their opinions as to what the hottest topics in the local community are.
2.	16	Broadcasted announcements on WFRQ, WHYA, WKFY and WPXC to disseminate EEO information to potential recruitment sources, and to be notified when full time openings occur at CodComm Inc. These announcements were also published on CodComm's website: http://capecodradio.com
3.	7	Participated and sponsored a student in the 2016 Massachusetts Broadcasters Association Student Broadcaster Scholarship program. This program encourages students who are interested in careers in broadcasting to apply for a \$2,000 scholarship towards degrees at colleges and universities offering degrees in radio and television broadcasting. The "winning" applicant was chosen after reviewing 24 qualified students.
4.	5	Codcomm Established a paid internship program designed to assist members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment. Our 3 summer interns represented Pace University, UMASS Amherst, and Nichols College. Each student earned college credit for their efforts while employed at CodComm.
5.	10	On October 17, 2016 Codcomm's Production Director

		along with WPXC’s programming assistant and midday personality participated in the “WKKL Speaker Series Program” at Cape Cod Community College which related to career opportunities in broadcasting specifically.
6.	1	<p>Participated in a job fair:</p> <p>Codcomm’s President was a guest speaker at Emerson College in Boston at the Emerson Career Day on October 10, 2016 from 12 Noon – 4PM. He addressed the broadcasting student staff of WERS-FM, the student operated radio station. The talk was a review of how radio operates in the current age of internet, with various formats competing for the same listeners, and how radio's greatest strength is the companionship and local information it uniquely can provide. He also invited them to visit the stations to learn how a local commercial station functions today in a small market and how to prepare for future full time job openings at CodComm Inc.</p>
7.	4	<p>On Wednesday, November 2, 2016 the entire full time on air staff of CodComm Inc. along with the station manager welcomed students from Cape Cod Community Colleges’ “Project Forward” program. All 8 students were given a tour of the station facilities and were shown studio equipment and broadcasting skills and techniques.</p>
